1)	IHS Orkney receives bi-annual reports from Public Concern at Work regarding the number of calls eceived, but due to the low numbers reported these are always noted as "0-3 calls received" to rotect the identity of callers. As such, we are unable to provide an accurate figure of the number of alls received.
2)	o date NHS Orkney has not been given any information regarding the nature of concerns raised nrough the Confidential Alert Line.
3)	o date NHS Orkney has not been given any personal data about callers.
4)	Public Concern at Work provided training during April 2017 to Designated Whistleblowing Contracts or NHS Boards
5)	IHS Orkney's Whistleblowing Policy was updated in March 2017 to include a form to be completed or any internal Whistleblowing concerns raised.
6)	he information recorded is the number of concerns and the nature of the concerns raised.

We are unable to disclose this information as the number of recorded instances as we are bound by the laws of confidentiality in respect of members of staff. Supplying the exact figure or the nature of

the concern could allow them to be indentified and would be a breach of the first principle of the Data Protection Act 1998, which is to process data fairly and lawfully. This information is therefore exempt under section 38(1)(b) of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.
